SUMMARY STATEMENT: The Brazos County Interjurisdictional Emergency Management Plan is developed and updated by the Emergency Management Coordinators of Brazos County, Texas A&M University and the cities of Bryan, College Station, Kurten, and Wixon Valley. The Plan was last updated in 2009.			
<p>The Emergency Management Plan outlines an agreed upon approach to emergency operations, and is applicable to the County and Cities. It provides general guidance for emergency management activities and an overview of approved methods of mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery. The plan describes emergency response organization and assigns responsibilities for various emergency tasks. The plan is intended to provide a framework for more specific annexes that describes in detail who does what, when, and how.</p> <p>The governing bodies of the other entities will also consider the Plan.</p>			
STAFF ANALYSIS AND RECOMMENDATION: This Interlocal agreement will ensure consistent and efficient emergency management coordination between all jurisdictions in Brazos County. The City of Bryan staff recommends approval of the Brazos County Interjurisdictional Emergency Management Plan.
