AGENDA ITEM DESCRIPTION: Ambulance Supplemental Payment Program (ASPP) Amendment #1 to Support Services Agreement – PST Services, Inc.			
<p>SUMMARY STATEMENT: On March 4, 2014, the City of Bryan entered into a business support services agreement with MED3000 for the Ambulance Supplemental Payment Program (ASPP). This program allows governmental ambulance providers to potentially receive payment, based on certain criteria, if the ambulance provider's allowable costs exceed the fee-for-service revenues collected during the same period. This program is funded through the Texas Health and Human Services Commission. The ambulance provider may receive supplemental payments up to the reconciled costs through the submission of an annual cost report. The City of Bryan contracted with MED3000 to prepare these costs reports to submit for this program.</p> <p>This amendment recognizes the purchase of MED3000 by PST Services, Inc. The amendment does not change the terms or the pricing of the original contract. The initial term of the original agreement is for thirty-six (36) months.</p>			
STAFF ANALYSIS AND RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends authorizing the Mayor to execute this amendment. Doing so will allow the City to continue to work with PST Services, Inc., formerly MED3000, to submit the required cost reports for the Ambulance Supplemental Payment Program. Collections during the first year of this program are estimated to be \$247,745.
