RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRYAN, TEXAS, AUTHORIZED BY SECTION 418.108 OF THE TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE, DECLARING AND EXTENDING A LOCAL STATE OF DISASTER IN THE CITY OF BRYAN, TEXAS, DUE TO EXCESSIVE AMOUNTS OF RAINFALL AND RECENT AREA-WIDE FLOODING; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Texas Disaster Act, Chapter 418 of the Texas Government Code, allows the City of Bryan to seek State aid in the case of a disaster defined as the imminent threat of widespread or severe damage, injury, or loss of life or property resulting from any natural or man-made cause including flooding;

WHEREAS, on May 26, 2016, the mayor issued a declaration of local disaster for the City of Bryan due to severe property damage resulting from a tornado and devastating, area-wide flooding due to excessive amounts of rainfall; and

WHEREAS, Section 418.108(b) of the Texas Government Code provides that a local state of disaster may not be continued for a period in excess of seven days without the consent of the governing body of the political subdivision; and authorizes this Resolution declaring and extending a local state of disaster,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRYAN, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. The continuation of a declaration of a local state of disaster is made by the Bryan City Council on this the 1st day of June, 2016.

SECTION 2. The declaration shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be promptly filed with the City Secretary as required by Section 418.108(c) of the Texas Government Code.

SECTION 3. This declaration will remain in effect until terminated by further action of the Bryan City Council.

SECTION 4. That this Resolution is passed as an emergency measure and shall become effective immediately after its passage.
