| Summary Statement* | <p>To reflect revised State code language, and in particular, identifying the amended code addressing "Retail Food," staff recommends the City Council approve the proposed ordinance. The proposed ordinance reflects that Volume 25, Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 228, "Retail Food" replaces the Texas Department of State Health Services, "Rules on Texas Food Establishments," 229.161 - 229.171 and 229.173 - 229.175. This section of the code is used by the Brazos County Health Department to enforce the City's rules and regulations for food service sanitation.</p> <p>This action is considered housekeeping in nature as rules and procedures merely fall within a different section of the Texas Administrative Code. To reflect this change, the proposed ordinances amends the City's Code of Ordinances to accurately reflect the change at the State level.</p> |
| Staff Analysis & Recommendation* | <p>City staff recommends approval of this housekeeping item, which reflects the change within State code addressing "Rules on Texas Food Establishments," or formerly "Retail Food."
